

What are trade unions?

The DGB (in German »Deutscher Gewerkschaftsbund«) is the largest umbrella organisation of trade unions in Germany. It has eight member unions with around six million members. The DGB covers all industries and economic sectors.

Trade unions represent workers' interests. With us, employees unite to address their workplace concerns. Among them are many students. Good salaries, regular pay raises, shorter working hours, special payments, more vacation days, professional qualifications, educational leave, and all this even for part-time jobs – that's what we stand for. Our collective agreements are our tools. Those are contracts between employers and a group of employees, represented by a trade union, which set the conditions of employment.

How trade unions benefit students

Most students have to work, often under precarious conditions – poorly paid, highly flexible, and insecure. Far too few are entitled to scholarships or other types of educational support. Most of them do not benefit from collective agreements and have to work for a minimum wage, which is already too low, given the skyrocketing costs of energy, food, and rent. We fight for an end to this precariousness in student life.

Reasons to unionize

Whether as work councils in companies or through DGB legal protection – we stand against racism and for respect and equality. Our demands:


- Equal pay for equal work!
